CONTINUING THE LEGACY

We of the Frankford Cemetery Association (FCA) community have inherited a rich legacy. Former association members and board members gave of their time and finances to insure that the cemetery, the church, and surrounding land were well cared for and preserved. Some of us remember a time when members volunteered to mow the cemetery and paid out of their own pockets for repairs and items needed to keep the cemetery going. This spirit of cooperation, born out of necessity, helped the Frankford Cemetery Association feel like a community with different members “pitching in” to give what they were able, be it finances, labor, or time.

Today, FCA’s financial footing is on firm ground. The Board maintains a conservative fiscal policy for the spending and investment of the association’s funds. Although FCA is on a very stable footing, the Board welcomes donations of time and finances to help us complete special projects to beautify and maintain the Frankford site. Some of these special projects include the replacement of large, aged trees along the creek, restoring and extending a tree line of native trees along the north and east borders of our property, and adding some native trees in the cemetery.

FRANKFORD PROJECTS

Since last Decoration Day, the Frankford Board of Directors has completed the following projects:

- Replaced the gravel on the old road along the northern border of the cemetery. Created a turnaround at the eastern end of this road to make “coming and going” in the cemetery easier.
- Added a “wing” on the south-eastern side of the concrete path in the middle of the cemetery. This will assist visitors with backing up their vehicles when leaving the cemetery.
- Repainted the metal supports of the bridge.
- Added trees and adjusted limestone blocks in the “wagon yard” in order to beautify the area and provide protection. Blocked access to the wagon yard area with a chain.
- Added a bois d’arc sign in the center of the turnaround at the Muirfield entrance.
- Completed the initial phase of removing non-native plants from our two-and-a-half acres of “virgin prairie.”
- Held a work day with Master Naturalist volunteers.
