Prairie in the City

All of us in the Frankford community, members and friends, are drawn to this special place for different reasons. Some have generations of ancestors buried in the cemetery and have buried loved ones and attended Frankford Decoration Days all their lives. Others discovered Frankford in recent years and acquired cemetery spaces for their families, treasuring the country like setting. Local historians appreciate Frankford's history as a stop on the Shawnee Trail and later as an early North Texas community that is significant in the settling of the Dallas area. Most every Frankford person loves the beautiful little prairie gothic church that has graced the Frankford site for a hundred and twelve years.

Recently, native landscape architect Rosa Finsley walked the Frankford site with board members and showed us still another reason to treasure this unique site. As we walked the meadow west and south of the old church and along the creek bank, Rosa pointed out native plants like buffalo grass, side-oats grama, pigeon berry, rough leaf dogwood, Eve's necklace, sumac, bois d' arc and pecan trees, four nerve daisy and native verbena. Rosa talked about the two different habitats at Frankford—the prairie and creek and the different types of plants indigenous to each one.

With the restoration of Frankford Church underway, the FCA Board is projecting toward a vision of the entire site that encompasses the Church, a future meeting hall, the cemetery, and the open space that includes the wagon yard area west of the creek. One of the key concerns in the vision is how to treat the open space, much of which still remains in its natural state.

Rosa Finsley opened our eyes to the treasure we have at Frankford. If we protect, enhance and preserve the entire site, including the open space, Frankford can continue to be an oasis in the midst of a sprawling metropolis. As Dallas continues to grow and North Texas development heads toward Oklahoma, sites like Frankford become more precious. If we are successful in our effort to protect the prairie land and creek, Frankford can serve as a haven for present and future generations. As renowned environmentalist John Muir said, "Everybody needs beauty as well as bread, places to play in and pray in where nature may heal and cheer and give strength to the body and soul."

#### **Church Restoration**

The restoration of Frankford Church began in August with the projected date of completion January 2010. We are now in the first stage of the restoration, which includes fixing the foundation and installing a heating/air conditioning system.

The pews and hymnals are carefully stored in a storage trailer provided by our contractors, Nedderman and Associates. An eight-foot fence with a lock on it surrounds the "staging area." The American elm tree behind the church where we held the Dinner on the Grounds last fall is also being carefully protected from damage by vehicles, etc.

The Frankford community looks forward to meeting in the newly restored church on Decoration Day in May, 2010. Thanks to everyone for your encouragement and interest in this exciting project.
